Boston's NPR affiliate **WBUR** covered the explosions through a live blog and posted a story about offering marathoners a place to stay in the wake of Monday's events.

The New York Times <u>published live updates throughout the afternoon about the explosions</u>, including <u>a video interview of a witness</u> at the blasts.

NBC News posted videos of the explosions and reactions including a special report of the tragedy.
